



The King's College, New York City Campus Housing Checklist Herald Towers and The Vogue

This Campus Housing Checklist will help you get prepared for life in midtown Manhattan! The items marked with an asterisk (*) are communal items, so it would be a good idea to call your future roommates to coordinate which items each of you is going to bring. All apartments are furnished with bunk-beds, chests of drawers, desks, chairs, lamps, a dining table, a sofa, and kitchen supplies (see details below). Remember that New York City apartments are charmingly small and plan accordingly.

Linens

- Pillow
- Bedding (mattress pad, sheets, blanket) for a standard twin-size bunk bed.
- Bath and hand towels, washcloths, robe
- Dish towels*

Toiletries

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Brush and comb
- Shaving supplies
- Hair dryer
- Shampoo
- Bath soap
- Basket/bag (to carry or hold toiletries)
- Personal hygiene items (deodorant, etc.)
- Toilet paper*

Laundry

You can purchase a laundry card upon arrival to which you can add money as needed (card machines are located in the lobby at The Vogue and in the laundry room at The Herald Towers. One washer load costs \$2.25--\$2.35 and one dryer load costs \$2.00--\$2.50, depending on the facility.

- Laundry bag or basket
- Laundry soap
- Stain remover
- Iron and ironing board*
- Knowledge of how to do laundry or money to pay someone to do it

Clothing

- Business casual clothes
(Students are expected to dress in business casual attire during business hours Monday-Friday, and after 5pm if going to class.)
- Exercise and casual clothes
- A formal outfit (for spring dance)
- A warm winter coat
- Rain shoes/boots
- Raincoat and umbrella

Cleaning Supplies

- Dish soap*
- Sponges, dish scrubbers*
- Swiffer, broom, dustpan*
- Dish-drying rack*
- Bathroom, window, kitchen, and floor cleaner*
- Dusting spray/cloths*

Appliances and Utensils

Basic kitchen appliances (microwave, stove, and refrigerator) and utensils (pots, pans, bowls, plates, silverware, a can opener, glasses, mugs, etc) are provided, but you may wish to bring:

- Teakettle*
- Coffee pot*
- Blender*
- Hand mixer*
- Toaster*

Decorations

- Anything to decorate your room and make you feel at home including plants, a decorative shower curtain (basic liners are provided), floor pillows, etc.*

Tools and First Aid

- Hammer, screwdriver*
- Battery-powered flashlight
- First aid kit, including pain relievers, Band-aids, antibiotic ointment, an ace bandage, etc.

Technology

- Alarm clock
- Camera
- I-Pod/MP3 player
- PDA/organizer/planner
- Cell phone and charger
- Laptop or desktop computer with peripherals
(wireless internet is provided in each room)
- Printer
- Power strip/surge protector
- DVD player*
- Television*

Miscellaneous

- Desk lamp
- Bible and journal
- Tape
- Hangers
- AA batteries
- Backpack/school bag
- Trash can (for your desk)
- Pictures of family and friends
- Your insurance card/health insurance information
- Sewing kit
