Health and Wellness

With mention of Tami Festa, or Dr. Drullinsky, a student of The King's College will:

- Receive priority service,
- Pay an initial \$90 service rate (reduced from \$125), and subsequently pay \$65 for all future visits if they do not have insurance, and have the ability to make a payment plan for service charges

If a student exhibits behaviors that indicate he or she may self-inflict harm or harm others, the College may intervene to protect the individual's well-being as well as the King's community. Additionally, The King's College reserves the right to refer a student for a psychological, psychiatric or alcohol/drug evaluation as a pre-condition to continue attending classes and residing in College housing. In such cases, results are used to determine a mutually beneficial course of action for the student and his or her residential community.

Health Insurance

The King's College offers a customized student health insurance plan administered and underwritten by United Health Care. The King's student health insurance plan is designed to

provide quality health care coverage at a price suited to a student's budget. All students are required to show proof of insurance. Instructions for doing so can be found at: <http://www.tkc.edu/students/resources/insurance.html>.

If a student has been enrolled under his/her parents' policy, he/she should check to see if coverage still applies. Group health plans often do not cover full-time student dependents once they have reached a specific age, or when they are married. In addition, students who have declared financial independence for financial aid may not be covered. We also urge students who are covered by an HMO, PPO or similar policy to determine the extent of coverage available.

Family, Educational Rights and Privacy Act – FERPA

FERPA is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. Education records contain information such as an academic transcript, financial aid and student account records.

Students have the right to inspect their educational record, to request in writing that the University correct inaccurate or misleading educational records, and to prevent the College from disclosing information about students without permission.

Philosophy of Discipline—The Honor Code

The Honor System at The King's College exists to foster in students a resolve to live above the intellectual and moral mediocrity of our day. Honor governs the academic and social atmosphere of The King's College community, engendering an atmosphere of trust and honesty, making pursuit of truth possible.

Every student, faculty and staff member makes a public pledge to uphold the Honor Code and the shared community expectations outlined in the Student Handbook. These two documents combined express our expectations. A student's pledge is signified in his or her signing of the Honor Code during New Student Orientation. Specifically, the Honor Code states:

A student of The King's College will not lie, cheat, steal, or turn a blind eye to those who do. Every student is honor bound to confront any other student who breaches the Honor Code.

Occasionally, there are violations of the Honor Code or of community standards outlined in the Student Handbook. When this happens, students are expected to confront one another. Confrontation typically occurs among members of the same House community, where there is a level of familiarity and trust. When a violation is repeated or particularly egregious, it goes before the Honor Council. The Honor Council consists of students appointed from each House, as well as faculty and staff. The Council takes pains to provide an impartial hearing of the case, but is swift to protect the community when needed. The Council has the authority to determine consequences for infractions, including disciplinary probation or suspension. If desired, students may appeal Council decisions through the Appeals Board.

Emergency Action Plan/Safety

*Students are required to submit a \$50 nonrefundable housing application fee as well as a \$400 security deposit that will be returned to the student upon their departure from The King's College provided the room is in the same condition as when entered.

Note: 100% of full-time students at The King's College receive some combination of institutional, federal and/or state aid.

Student Activity Fee

Each semester students are required to pay a \$175 student activity fee that partially covers many house and student body-wide activities, such as Homecoming events and House Competitions. This fee is charged to the student's account.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

Students who withdraw from a course will be entitled to a refund of tuition and/or fees in keeping with the schedule below.

The following schedule is based upon the date the written withdrawal request is received by the bursar or registrar:

Fall & Spring Semester

1 st week:	100% Refund
2 nd week:	75% Refund
3 rd week:	50% Refund
4 th week:	25% Refund
After 4 th week:	No Refund

Six Week Summer Sessions

1 st week:	70% Refund
2 nd week:	30% Refund
After 2 nd week:	No Refund

The refund schedule will be prorated for classes shorter than six weeks.

Failure to attend class does not constitute a withdrawal and does not entitle the student to a refund of tuition. Students who are administratively withdrawn for poor attendance, or for disciplinary reasons, will not receive a refund.

Finding a Job on Campus

The King's College offers a limited number of student employment opportunities, including positions in various departments as well as teaching assistants. Student employees will not be allowed to work more than 20 hours a week unless otherwise approved by Human Resources.

Students must have a minimum of a 2.0 GPA to be considered for employment. Students

dropping below a 2.0 grade point average during a semester in which they are employed will have their position terminated at the end of the semester. Work is not an excuse for absenteeism or arriving late for a class.

VISITING KING'S

On-campus Overnight Guest Policies

If you, a family member, or friend would like to visit your student and stay in their apartment, the following guidelines should be taken into account before making plans:

- Opposite gender guests are not permitted to stay overnight.
- Residents can host overnight visitors for a maximum of three consecutive days in a seven-day period, and no more than ten nights in a month.
- The maximum cumulative semester stay for any guest is six nights.
- Residents must be present during guest's stay and are responsible for the guest's actions.
- For Ludlow residents only: Once approval is granted by a Residence Life Student Worker, residents must obtain an overnight pass by visiting the Ludlow security desk and requesting that a pass be issued/signed by a Ludlow security officer before 11:00 p.m. on the day of a requested overnight visit.
- Guest and/or host behavior inconsistent with The King's College expectations may result in revocation of guest privileges and/or other disciplinary action deemed necessary to ensure safety and security of the King's community.

During school breaks, at the Herald Towers, Vogue, and Clark Street, there is no limit to the length of guest stays when only one resident is present in a room. If more than one resident is present in a room, guests can stay up to three nights consecutively or up to 4 nights cumulatively within any two week period. The following stipulations apply:

- Only same sex guests are allowed to stay (with the exception of immediate family members if there is only one resident present).
- Students may not allow guests to use their room if they are not present.
- Residents are responsible for the actions of their guests and must ensure that guests comply with building and college regulations. Guests must also respect the rights of roommates.
- Inappropriate behavior on the part of the host or guest may result in revocation of guest privileges (for the host) and removal from housing (for the guest).

Ludlow school-break overnight guest policies are the same as when school is in session (as noted above).
